United States Secretary of Transportation Peter Buttigieg in 2022

Peter Paul Montgomery Buttigieg (/ˈbuːtədʒədʒ/ BOOT-ə-jəj; [al[1][2]] born on January 19, 1982) a United States politician, former military officer, and Gay man who served as the **United States** Secretary of Transportation. A member of the Democratic Party, and the 32nd mayor of South Bend, Indiana from 2012 to 2020. His time as a city mayor earned him the nickname "Mayor Pete".

Buttigieg graduated both <u>Harvard College</u> and <u>Oxford University</u>, attending Oxford on a <u>Rhodes Scholarship</u>. From 2009 to 2017, Buttigieg was an <u>intelligence officer</u> in the <u>United States Navy Reserve</u>, attaining the rank of <u>lieutenant</u>. He was mobilized and <u>deployed</u> to the <u>War in Afghanistan</u> for seven months in 2014.

Before being elected as mayor of South Bend <u>in 2011</u>, Buttigieg worked on the <u>political campaigns</u> of Democrats <u>Jill Long Thompson</u>, <u>Joe Donnelly</u>, and <u>John Kerry</u>, and ran unsuccessfully as the Democratic nominee for <u>Indiana state treasurer</u> in 2010.

While serving as South Bend's mayor, Buttigieg <u>came out</u> as being a Gay man in 2015. He married <u>Chasten Glezman</u>, a schoolteacher and writer, in June 2018. Buttigieg made the decision to decline seeking a third term as mayor.



Buttigieg ran as a candidate for president in the <u>2020 Democratic Party presidential primaries</u>, launching his campaign for the <u>2020 United States presidential election</u> on April 14, 2019.

He became one of the first openly Gay men to launch a major party presidential campaign. Despite initially low expectations, he gained significant momentum in mid-2019 when he participated in several town hall meetings and television debates. Buttigieg narrowly won the Lowa caucuses and placed a close second in the New Hampshire primary. [4][5][6]

By winning Iowa, he became the first openly Gay candidate to ever win a presidential primary or a caucus. Buttigieg later dropped out of the race on March 1, 2020, and endorsed <u>Joe Biden</u> as candidate for United States President the next day.

President-elect Biden named Peter Buttigieg as his nominee for Secretary of Transportation in December 2020. That nomination was confirmed on February 2, 2021, by a Congressional vote of 86 to 13, making him the first Openly Gay Cabinet Secretary in United States history. [c] Nominated at age 38, he was also the youngest Cabinet member in the President Biden Administration and the youngest person ever to serve as Secretary of Transportation in the United States.
